Mike Rollin has used the premise of a well-known tale to create a fast-moving story of romance between a People's Princess and the son of a powerful, wealthy man determined to gain British citizenship - at any cost. The short chapters and crisp writing keep the story moving along in what feels like real time. With active point of view shifts, the reader is able to glean the entire story from every imaginable angle which makes the tale ever more compelling.
